

# WESTERN LOOP

MARY VALLEY DRIVE | Imbil - Kandanga - Amamoor - Gympie - Wolvi (183km day trip)

Discover the gentle rolling hills of the Mary Valley, a patchwork of wooded forest reserves, paddocks of grazing cattle, tasty fresh produce and friendly villages.

## WESTERN LOOP TIPS

- Stretching from Kenilworth to Gympie, the Mary Valley will get you back in touch with nature and let you discover country hospitality and an easier pace of life.
- ✓ Do an early morning kayak on Yabba Creek to look for platypus.
- Enjoy a drive through the forested valleys of the Amamoor State Forest before embarking on a walk next to trickling creeks and streams surrounded by Hoop Pine and Red Cedar trees.
- ✓ Visit the Mary Valley Rattler Heritage Station in Gympie.
- From Amama day-use area, take the short walk to a viewing platform for a chance to see a platypus.
- At Lake Borumba you can water ski, kayak or fish before enjoying the sunset across the valley from Imbil Lookout.
- Get a real taste of the Mary Valley over a short break staying in a local B&B and experience some of the region's local produce.
- Hire a bike and cruise along the Mary Valley Rail Trail from Imbil to Brooloo.

- Some businesses are closed on Mondays and Tuesdays in the Noosa hinterland. Make sure to check opening hours before heading out.
- Some roads on this drive are gravel roads and some areas may not have mobile phone service.
- Keep your eyes open for 'honesty boxes' on your way you won't find fresher produce than straight from a farm gate.

# NORTHERN LOOP

Boreen Point - Kin Kin - Cooran (112km day trip) Boreen Point - Kin Kin - Cooran - Wolvi (146km day trip)

Prepare for a paddock to plate experience, aquatic adventures, historic sites, creative communities, vintage stores and scenic lookouts on this magnificent drive.

### NORTHERN LOOP TIPS

- At dusk and dawn, you can watch eastern grey kangaroos graze at Elanda Point located at Lake Cootharaba.
- ✓ Hire a kayak and glide over the tranquil water of Lake Cootharaba. The lake is the gateway to the upper Noosa River, the ancient Everalades and the Great Sandy National Park.
- Step back in time and visit Mill Point, one of Queensland's earliest timber settlements. The mill closed in 1892, but remnants can still be seen today.
- Enjoy some good old country hospitality. Visit a typical Aussie country pub or purchase locally made products at a farm gate.
- ✓ Pick your own strawberries and blueberries and enjoy handmade ice-cream. Head north to Wolvi, a 34km detour but well worth it.
- Enjoy a cold beer at a country-style brewery or find rare collectables and second-hand treasures in Cooran.
- Enjoy breathtaking coastal and hinterland views at James McKane Memorial Lookout in Cooran.

## CENTRAL LOOP

Pomona - Cooroy - Lake Macdonald - Tinbeerwah (91km day trip)

Expect breathtaking views from lookouts, unique experiences such as silent movies, ghostly encounters or historic sites on this unique drive.

#### CENTRAL LOOP TIPS

- ✓ Planning your trip on a weekend? Make sure to visit Pomona's Country Market - details on noosacountrydrive.com.au.
- Watch a silent movie in the world's oldest silent movie theatre the iconic Majestic Theatre in Pomona.
- ✓ Test your fitness and climb the 439m high volcanic rock of Mt Cooroora. It's challenging but you will be rewarded with exceptional views.
- Stop at one of the quaint cafés or browse through one of the antique stores selling second-hand and retro items.
- Walk through the Mill Place Precinct in the heart of Cooroy with the Cooroy Library, historic Butter Factory Arts Centre, and the Lower Mill Site housing a restored boilerhouse and kilns - you can even hear from Pepper's Ghost about the town's history.
- Stroll through the beautiful Botanic Gardens on the shores of Lake Macdonald.
- Drive to Mt Tinbeerwah Lookout and catch a great sunset photo with the Noosa hinterland mountains as a backdrop.

## SOUTHERN LOOP

Doonan - Eumundi - Cooroy - Tinbeerwah (90km day trip)

Discover tranquil lakes, an abundance of nature and wildlife, vibrant markets, indigenous encounters and picturesque sunrises and sunsets atop a mountain lookout.

- ✓ Soak in the sun on the shores of magnificent Lake Weyba.
- ✓ Visit the Eumundi Markets with over 500 market stalls every Wednesday and Saturday and Eumundi Square Markets also every Friday morning.
- ✓ Wander under the shade of magnificent memorial fig trees and pick up a historical walk booklet at the Discover Eumundi Visitor Centre and learn about the town's history.
- Try a bush tucker meal featuring native Australian ingredients and learn about the traditional custodians of the region, the local Kabi Kabi people.
- ✓ Visit one of the 'World's Coolest Modern Libraries' in Cooroy or the Butter Factory Arts Centre displaying work of local artists and offering a range of art workshops.
- Stroll through the idyllic Noosa Botanic Gardens located on the shores of Lake Macdonald. You can see exotic and native plant species and might even spot a majestic osprey.
- Finish off a perfect Noosa country day by soaking in sensational 360 degree views and a picturesque sunset at Mt Tinbeerwah.
